SUMMER STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

Study in the scenic landscapes and historic piazzas of one of Europe's earliest centers of globalization! Florence manifests dual identities as a center of Italian history and culture and a modern global European city. This program examines the ways that local, regional, national, continental, and global conditions shape and are shaped by Italian culture. Students will explore Florence as a site of contemporary European culture in courses that ask questions like: how has Italian immigration and emigration impacted global patterns of human mobility? How does Italy reflect trends of a new, global Europe? How do contemporary politics play out in the Italian theatre? Using Florence as the starting point and exploring **Rome** and **Venice**, participants will examine Italy's global impact.
