SUMMER STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

This program is designed to provide site-based enrichment for students enrolled in HST 328 (spring 2018). We will travel to St. Petersburg and Moscow in the Russian Federation as guests of one of Russia's premier research universities, the Higher School of Economics. Students will use multiple aspects of the experience—guest lectures, museum visits, and other opportunities—to complete a key course assignment. Walking the streets of St. Petersburg and Moscow will provide students an opportunity to visit key sites connected to Russia's imperial past, following in the footsteps of prominent historical figures in our readings. Students will also have the opportunity to observe contemporary life in Russia's major urban centers, meet Russian peers, and visit premier collections of art and other cultural riches all organized to encourage an appreciation of Russia's history and culture.
